SAL 12 Step recovery meetings were formed in May of 2014 by the founders of the SA Lifeline Foundation—Steven C. and Rhyll C. SA Lifeline Foundation offers support and educational resources to SAL 12 Step groups who function autonomously through the service of group members. SAL utilizes the White Book and the Step into Action books from Sexaholics Anonymous as well as the Big Book and Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions of Alcoholics Anonymous as our primary study materials.

Some of the key fundamental principles of SAL include gender specific meetings, an emphasis on 'prayers from the heart,' and an open (non-proselyting) environment for those of all religious and non-religious affliations. For more information about SAL 12 Step meetings visit *sal12step.org*.

'The 12 Steps of Sexaholics Anonymous

- 1. We admitted that we were powerless over lust—that our lives had become unmanageable.
- 2. Came to believe that a Power greater than ourselves could restore us to sanity.
- 3. Made a decision to turn our will and our lives over to the care of God as we understood Him.
- 4. Made a searching and fearless moral inventory of ourselves.
- 5. Admitted to God, to ourselves, and to another human being the exact nature of our wrongs.
- 6. Were entirely ready to have God remove all these defects of character.
- 7. Humbly asked Him to remove our shortcomings.
- 8. Made a list of all persons we had harmed, and became willing to make amends to them all.
- 9. Made direct amends to such people wherever possible, except when to do so would injure them or others.
- 10. Continued to take personal inventory and when we were wrong promptly admitted it.
- 11. Sought through prayer and meditation to improve our conscious contact with God *as we understood Him*, praying only for knowledge of His will for us and the power to carry that out.
- 12. Having had a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps, we tried to carry this message to sexaholics, and to practice these principles in all our affairs.

The Serenity Prayer

God grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time, accepting hardship as the pathway to peace, taking, as He did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it, trusting that He will make all things right if I surrender to His Will, that I may be reasonably happy in this life, and supremely happy with Him forever in the next. Thy will, not mine be done.

We will lose interest in selfish things and gain interest in our fellows. 8. Self-seeking will slip away. 9. Our whole attitude and outlook upon life will change. 10. Fear of people and of economic insecurity will leave us. 11. We will intuitively know how to handle situations which used to baffle us. 12. We will suddenly realize that God is doing for us what we could not do for ourselves.
